Re : SPCA Selangor appealed to the authority concerned for taking over the two mongrels involved in the “dogs attack” case at Taman Putra Perdana, Puchong.

In response to the public's request, SPCA Selangor has made an appeal to Dr Nor Aidah bt Abdul Rahim, the director of Jabatan Perkhidmatan Haiwan Negeri Selangor, Encik Mohamed Radzuan bin Malek, Ketua Pegarah Bahagian Penguatkuasa Jabatan Perkhidmatan Haiwan and Supritendan Zahedi Ayob, Ketua Polis Daerah Sepang to rescue the two mongrels which did not attack the boy.

“Dogs will never have the opportunity to attack people if they are taken care of by responsible owners. Malaysians should be taught to respect and care for all kinds of animals with full responsibilities especially to domestic cats and dogs which are sharing their lives with human beings,” said Miss Christine Chin, the chairperson of SPCA Selangor.

SPCA Selangor feels that a fair decision should be given to the two innocent dogs which did not attack the boy. The helpless and defenseless dogs which cannot speak for themselves should not be blamed.
