

THE KEY FOUNDATION PILLARS OF SPCA



PET ADOPTION CENTRE & TEMPORARY SHELTER

For abandoned and abused animals.

An ambulance is available to pick up injured animals.

Advise owners to be responsible & spay/neuter their pets and not to dump them.

SPCA re-homes 1,200 spayed/neutered dogs and cats each year and receives 7,000 animals per annum.

KLINIK KEMBIRI

A low-cost high-volume spay/neuter clinic in collaboration with DBKL.

Highly successful. About 2,000 animals are spayed each year at Klinik Kembiri. Since 2003, over 20 million unwanted births were avoided.

INSPECTORATE

Inspects and monitors all complaints of cruelty to animals from the public.

About 70 reports per month.

Works closely with enforcement officers to assist in preventing cruelty and prosecuting cases.

SPCA receives and acts on 600 cruelty cases each year.

GOVERNMENT LOBBYING

Actively lobbies with DVS to standardise and mandate humane stray animal control : humane catching, housing and euthanasia.

SPCA meets regularly with DVS to lobby for effective legislation, building more Klinik Kembiris and humane management of Municipal Pounds.

HUMANE EDUCATION

To create awareness, empower and motivate people to be agents of change to improve animal welfare & related issues.

To spread the power of compassion and to promote kindness to animals.

Thousands of school students visit SPCA and volunteer, and an educational pack is given to all students.

SPCA educates over 3,000 students each year and goes out frequently for outreach work.

MISSION HELP

SPCAs outreach arm aims to improve the lives of animals beyond our reach through dedicated animal rescuers to promote better welfare for homeless animals.

SPCA provides highly or fully subsidised food, vaccination and spay/neuter costs for Good Samaritans who are caring for stray animals in their neighbourhoods.
